There was extensive public outreach during selection of projects for the Southwest Sidewalk Infill program, including open houses, mailings, and visits with property owners.

Bureau staff worked with Southwest Neighborhoods, Inc. to identify and select priority sidewalk projects to build with \$8 million for sidewalks on arterial streets in Southwest Portland. This was one of several identified projects that are currently in some phase of design or development.
