This action is estimated to cost the CityFleet replacement fund \$908,040 in FY 2012-13. The Portland Bureau of Transportation pays for future vehicle replacement in the interagency with CityFleet and the funds for this purchase do not affect the present year PBOT budget. CityFleet has budgeted in FY 2012-13 capital replacement budget for the procurement of these four sweepers. There is no estimated increase in ongoing operations or maintenance for these replacement vehicles for PBOT.

The cost to delay this purchase could be significant. Retaining vehicles beyond the economic life-cycle leads to costly repairs and lowers salvage values. This would affect the PBOT expenses for regular repairs and maintenance and could be outside the FY 2012-13 Adopted Budget amounts.

7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

CityFleet has reviewed the 2012 replacement schedule and the condition of Bureau of Transportation street sweepers and has determined that the vehicles requested are appropriate. The estimated cost of these sweepers is \$227,010 per truck, or \$908,040 for four.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Bureau of Transportation has four street sweepers scheduled for life-cycle replacement, and the estimated cost to replace them is \$908,040.
