 - a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item? This project will cause noise, vibration, traffic congestion, temporary parking loss, lane reductions, and street closures in the construction zone, access issues, and disruption to normal neighborhood activity.

Access to the Buckman School campus will be restricted during the summer months when sewer construction is underway. Access to the Buckman Pool will be maintained.

There will be access restrictions and delays to the south side of Saint Francis Church. Access to the church park will not be affected.

Normal truck routes and loading door access for Franz Bakery will be impacted.

Several other businesses will experience access issues and delays.

There are seven properties with nonconforming sewers within the boundaries of this project all have been in contact with City staff.

Portland Public School officials requested that work on the Buckman School campus be done during the summer months when school is not in session. This request is now in the project contract.

Businesses in the project area were assured that access would be maintained for their shipping and receiving needs. Residents were informed that local access will be maintained, but they will experience delays in getting to their destinations.

Authorize contract and provide payment for construction of the SE Oak St Sewer Replacement - SE 10th Ave to SE 18th Ave, Project E09095 (Ordinance) (contract amount \$2,000,000)

II. BACKGROUND

The 24 inch VSP structurally failed at SE 16th Avenue and SE Oak Street in 2006 and a large sinkhole developed, in which a City vehicle fell into. Over 2,200 feet of structurally failing sewer will be replaced by this project.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The estimated construction cost for this project is \$2,000,000. Our level of confidence in this estimate is high.

Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2013-2014 Budgets, Bureau of Environmental Services, WBS code E09095.C60.

IV. LEGAL ISSUES

There are no legal issues.
