# COLLECTION AGREEMENT Between The PORTLAND WATER BUREAU CITY OF PORTLAND And The USDA, FOREST SERVICE COLUMBIA RIVER GORGE NATIONAL SCENIC AREA

This COLLECTION AGREEMENT is hereby entered into by and between the City of Portland Water Bureau, hereinafter referred to as "the City", and the USDA, Forest Service, Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area, hereinafter referred to as the "U.S. Forest Service," under the provisions of the Granger-Thye Act of April 24, 1950.

Background: In 2008, the Portland Water Bureau began to implement the Bull Run Water Supply Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP), which was developed to obtain long-term regulatory compliance with both the Endangered Species Act and the water quality requirements of the federal Clean Water Act. HCP Measure H-8 – Sandy 1 Reestablishment of River Mouth requires the City to contribute to the removal of the Sandy River Delta Dam in the Sandy River to provide improved riparian habitat and passage for salmon. The U.S. Forest Service owns the access to and the land adjacent to the dam removal project site and will be working with the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) when ACOE removes the dam.

<u>Title</u>: Sandy River Delta Dam Removal

I. PURPOSE: The purpose of this agreement, and incorporated Financial Plan, is to document the voluntary contribution of funds from the City to the U.S. Forest Service to remove a portion of a dam and restore flow in the historic main channel of the Sandy River in the Sandy River Delta. The U.S. Forest Service will be working with the Army Corps of Engineers under a separate agreement to accomplish this project. Funds from the City will be used to fund a portion of the Sandy River Delta Dam removal. The Army Corps of Engineers will fund the remainder of the dam removal as identified in their National Environmental Policy Act documents for the project.

### II. THE CITY SHALL:

A. <u>LEGAL AUTHORITY</u>. The City shall have the legal authority to enter into this agreement, and the institutional, managerial, and financial capability to ensure proper planning, management, and completion of the project, which includes funds sufficient to pay the nonfederal share of project costs, when applicable.

- B. Perform in accordance with the Financial Plan.
- C. Upon presentation of a Bill for Collection, deposit with the U.S. Forest Service the amount agreed to in the Financial Plan.

### III. THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

A. <u>ADVANCE BILLING</u>. The U.S. Forest Service shall bill the City prior to commencement of work for deposits sufficient to cover the estimated costs (including overhead) for the specific payment period. Overhead is assessed at the rate of 3.0 percent.

Billing Method: Single lump sum advance bill.

- B. Perform in accordance with the attached Financial Plan.
- C. The U.S. Forest Service will initially invoice the City for \$200,000.00 After July 1, 2013, the U.S. Forest Service shall invoice the City for an additional \$83,250.00.
- D. <u>SPECIAL BILLING REQUIREMENTS PROGRAM DOCUMENTATION</u>. The U.S. Forest Service Program Manager shall provide the City with a written report that meets the City's specific documentation requirements.

# IV.IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

- B. <u>FOREST SERVICE LIABILITY TO THE COOPERATOR</u>. The United States shall not be liable to the City for any costs, damages, claims, liabilities, and judgments that arise in connection with the performance of work by the U.S. Forest Service or its contractors under this collection agreement, including but not limited to fire suppression costs and damage to any property owned by the City or any third party.
- C. <u>REFUNDS</u>. Funds collected in advance by the U.S. Forest Service, which are not spent or obligated for the project(s) approved under this agreement, may be refunded to the City, authorized for use for a new agreement by the City, or waived by the City. A DUNS number and registration in the Central Contractor Registry (CCR) by the City may be necessary to process a refund. Due to processing costs, any balance less than \$25 shall not be refunded to the City.
- D. <u>FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA)</u>. Public access to agreement records must not be limited, except when such records must be kept confidential and would have been exempted from disclosure pursuant to Freedom of Information regulations (5 U.S.C. 552).
- E. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This agreement in no way restricts the U.S. Forest Service or the City from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
- F. <u>ENDORSEMENT</u>. Any of the City's contributions made under this agreement do not by direct reference or implication convey U.S. Forest Service endorsement of the City's products or activities.
- G. <u>NOTICES</u>. Any communication affecting the operations covered by this agreement by the U.S. Forest Service or the City will be sufficient only if in writing and delivered in person, mailed, or transmitted electronically by e-mail or fax, as follows:

To the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager, at the address specified in the agreement.

To the City, at the City's address shown in the agreement or such other address designated within the agreement.

Notices are effective when delivered in accordance with this provision, or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.

- H. TERMINATION FOR COLLECTION AGREEMENTS. Either party, in writing, may terminate this agreement in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of expiration. The U.S. Forest Service shall not incur any new obligations for the terminated portion of this agreement after the effective date of termination and shall cancel as many obligations as possible. Full credit must be allowed for U.S. Forest Service expenses and all non-cancelable obligations properly incurred up to the effective date of termination. Excess funds must be refunded in accordance with the REFUND provision of the agreement.
- I. <u>DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION</u>. The City shall immediately inform the U.S. Forest Service if they or any of their principals are presently excluded, debarred, or suspended from entering into covered transactions with the Federal Government according to the terms of 2 CFR Part 180. Additionally, should the City or any of their principals receive a transmittal letter or other official Federal notice of debarment or suspension, then they shall notify the U.S. Forest Service without undue delay. This applies whether the exclusion, debarment, or suspension is voluntary or involuntary.
- J. <u>MODIFICATIONS</u>. Modifications within the scope of this agreement must be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification signed and dated by all properly authorized, signatory officials, prior to any changes being performed. Requests for modification should be made, in writing, at least 30 days prior to implementation of the requested change.
- K. <u>COMMENCEMENT/EXPIRATION DATE</u>. This agreement is executed as of the date of the last signature, and has an expiration date of June 30, 2014. The expiration date is the final date for completion of all work activities under this agreement.

L. <u>AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES</u>. By signature below, each party certifies that the individuals listed in this document as representatives of the individual parties are authorized to act in their respective areas for matters related to this agreement.
