

7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) has an on-going need for asphaltic concrete mixtures on an annual basis to perform routine road maintenance and paving work. Street work can be located in various locations throughout the City, therefore The City has determined that more than one price agreement is necessary to ensure adequate and efficient availability and delivery of asphalt materials in a cost effective manner. The use of any contractors will be based on availability, delivery, location of the work, and inspection and testing to assure the best value to the bureau. With the passage of Ordinance 185882, PBOT received Council authorization to request the Chief Procurement Officer solicit for bids for asphalt supply contracts.

The Chief Procurement Officer advertised ITB #115045 for Asphalt Supply on February 8, 2013 and six (6) bids were received. The bids were reviewed and evaluated in accordance with Portland City Code 5.33. Bids from five (5) of the bidders were deemed responsive to the requirements of the solicitation and contract awards will be made to all responsive bidders. The contractual amounts are determined on historical usage, two (2) of the awards will require Council approval. The City issued a Notice of Intent to Award price agreements to all responsive bidders on March 1, 2013 and no protests are pending.

Porter W. Yett Company and K.F. Jacobsen & Company, Inc., have current City of Portland business licenses, are in full compliance with the Equal Benefits Program, and their EEO Certifications are current. These firms are located in the Portland metro area and are not State Certified MWESB contractors. The Bureau's level of confidence in the cost estimate for this project is High as there is very good historical information showing purchases made for this type of commodity. These contracts will allow PBOT to continue to perform annual routine road maintenance and paving work throughout the City of Portland.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Asphaltic concrete mixtures will be provided on a regular basis and billed as utilized per the price agreements. The supplies to be provided under the price agreements are funded in the approved FY 12/13 PBOT budget, and funding for subsequent years will be included in the requested budget.
