Emergency item is requested in order to select consultants in order to initiate station area planning for the OMSI, Clinton, Rhine and Holgate Station and series of community events this coming summer 2013.

5. Purpose of Agenda Item:

METRO has notified the City of Portland that it will award a grant to the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability for the Portland Milwaukie Light Rail Transit: Employment Transit Oriented Development (PMLRT: E-TOD) Project in the amount of \$485,000. The PMLRT Project will result in plans for the Rhine-Holgate Station that would be recommended for adoption with the Comprehensive Plan and for the Clinton and OMSI Stations that would be adopted as part of the CC2035 Southeast Quadrant Plan.

6. History of Agenda Item/Background:

City Council approved the CET Grant application in January 2010 (Ordinance 183485) that included the request from BPS for the PMLRT E-TOD Project. However, due to Metro CET Grant

Program's legal challenges, this project was delayed until this was resolved. Metro notified BPS to proceed with this application last summer.

8. What individuals or groups are or would be supportive or opposed to this action? No opposition is expected.

As apart of the 2010 CET application, BPS received letters of support from several property owners, neighborhood organizations and business groups. BPS has contacted many of these same organizations and are supportive of this effort including the Central Eastside Industrial Council, OMSI, NW Natural, Hosford Abernethy NA, and TriMet.

9. How does this relate to current City policies?

This is a comprehensive planning project that complies with State and regional comprehensive planning requirements. The E-TOD project carries out objectives of the Portland Plan, including Economic Prosperity and Affordability, and Central City 2035 Goals and Policies for Regional Centers: Economy and Innovation.
