Requested Council Hearing Date:

I. RECOMMENDATION

*Authorize a no-cost Permit and Right of Entry agreement with the Port of Portland to grant city staff access to three Port sites...

II. BACKGROUND

The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) is working to improve watershed conditions and is conducting standardized assessments of streams and rivers across Portland through an effort called the Portland Area Watershed Monitoring and Assessment Program. The program assesses and track watershed conditions over time to implement the Portland Watershed Management Plan, adaptively manage capital projects and comply with state and federal regulations.

BES samples 32 sites each year on a four-year rotation (128 sites total). BES staff randomly selects sites using a statistical sample survey. At these sites, the following measurements are taken using standardized methods along an approximately 500-foot stream section:

- Water temperature, dissolved oxygen, nutrients, metals, and pathogens
- Vegetation, stream bed composition, and bank condition
- Native and non-native fish, amphibian, insects, and bird surveys

Three of the sites are on Port of Portland property and we have been working for years to secure a formal Right of Entry from them. For all other private property owners, we secure a simple permission to enter letter that only the landowner signs. The Port requires a formal Permit and Right of Entry agreement which includes indemnification.

The City Attorney advises that the indemnification requirement in the Port's Permit and Right of Entry requires authorization from City Council before the Director of BES can execute the permit.
