Public involvement is planned for both sites, but it is still too early in design to begin that process with the community. Public Affairs staff is assigned to each site and are working with the property owners. Planned public outreach and involvement for each site includes informational flyers, open house meetings, and mailed and emailed updates throughout the design and construction phases. Public Affairs staff and the design and construction staff members will be available to address concerns and answer questions from the public.

Project staff is working with property owners to build awareness of the project and to address their concerns. For instance, the Grotto requested that we suspend construction activities during their Christmas Lights season. Safeway requested that the new station design take into account the illegal camping issues that plague their site. Both issues are being addressed.

For both sites, the impacted neighborhood associations were notified. Staff will submit information to them when the project reaches 30% design; this is point at which enough is known to bring plans and present details for public comment.

Outreach will continue throughout the design and construction phases, with periodic updates to the surrounding community and to any interested persons who request that information.

I. RECOMMENDATION

Amend contract with BergerABAM for additional work and compensation for the Skidmore and Safeway Pump Station Remodels, Project Nos. E10291 and E10292.

<u>POTENTIAL FUTURE CONTRACT AMENDMENTS</u>: The negotiated scope and fee for the recommended contract does not anticipate the need for future contract amendments. However, it is possible that an unanticipated change in the required scope of work could occur for the following types of events that have occurred in the past on other wastewater pump station remodel/upgrade projects:

- Physical conditions can be discovered during the detailed field investigations of the pump station facility that may require more extensive upgrade or replacement of the structure to meet current code.
- A change in the required pumping capacity of future operational goals for the facility based on revisions or modifications to the overall sewer conveyance system due to ongoing analysis and system modeling by the BES Asset Systems Management.
- Resolution of constructability issues and coordination with the BES Construction Services Division during design development may require more effort than originally anticipated.
- Property or easement acquisition efforts may require unanticipated design revisions.
- The City may adopt a new policy, or modify the scope or application of any existing policy that could impact the scope of design required for the pump station facility.

 Project priorities for the overall sewer conveyance system might change that could require either acceleration or deferral of the project that could impact the consultant's level of effort.

II. BACKGROUND

Remodeling of the Skidmore and Safeway Wastewater Pump Stations has been undertaken as part of the Pump Station Improvement Program. Remodeling will reduce maintenance requirements and improve the reliability of these stations

This ordinance provides for additional work necessary to address design and construction phase services for additional geotechnical investigation, discharge manhole rehabilitation, and relocation of a parking lot light.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The estimated cost of this contract amendment is \$21,498. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2013 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Project Nos. E10291 and E10292.
