The budgets that now cover all street preservation for arterial/collector streets will have some of that money allocated to preservation on local roads that the City owns and for which it has maintenance authority.

Residents and users of the local street system should see preventive maintenance treatments applied to those streets that the City owns and for which it has maintenance authority.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

We continually receive service requests for pothole repairs and request for other fixes on local roads. Neighborhood Associations, Business Associations and bicyclist and pedestrians all request improvements on local roads. According to the 2012 Auditor Office's Community Survey, resident ratings of street maintenance, street smoothness, and street lighting all declined since 2008. 33 percent of residents in 2012 rated street maintenance as very good or good, compared to 41 percent in 2008.

Rescinding the 2009 local street pavement policy is a recommendation from the Auditor's Report: Street Pavement: Condition Shows need for better stewardship, February 2013.

- c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item? Service requests for improvements on local roads that the City owns and for which it has maintenance authority supports the need for reinstating the street preservation program on local roads.
