I. RECOMMENDATION

Authorize contract with Harper Houf Peterson Righellis, Inc. and provide payment for design services of the SE Hawthorne Sewer Improvements Project No. E08668 for \$422,441 (Ordinance)

II. BACKGROUND

The SE Hawthorne project includes the design and construction of improvements that will relieve sewer backups, repair structurally deficient pipes, and provide sewer extensions to properties with non-conforming sewer services. The project is part of the bureau's larger Tabor to the River Program.

The project area is generally bound by SE Madison to the north, SE Clay to the south, SE 50th to the east, and SE 41st to the west. Most project work is along SE Hawthorne Boulevard. BES staff reviewed the conceptual design recently and concluded the following elements should be included in this capital project:

- o 12 vegetated stormwater (a.k.a. green street) facilities.
- o 3,300 linear feet of combined sewer pipe replacement due to insufficient capacity (diameters ranging from 12 to 36 inches)
- o 550 linear feet of combined sewer pipe replacement due to poor structural condition (diameters ranging from 12 to 36 inches)
- 900 linear feet of new sanitary sewer pipe (8-inch diameter)

Approximately half of the sewer pipe improvements along SE Hawthorne lie below a 30" cast iron water transmission main built in 1926.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The established cost is \$422,441. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY2012-13 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, WBS Element E08668.

M/W/ESB participation after the authorization will be \$59,321, approximately 14% of the contract amount.
