I. RECOMMENDATION

To amend the contract with Portland Audubon Society to extend the contract for three additional years of work and compensation for the Bird Surveys at Oaks Bottom & Mt. Tabor Habitat Enhancement Project Sites for \$20,290 (Ordinance, Amend Contract No. 30001693).

II. BACKGROUND

BES has an existing contract with the Portland Audubon Society to provide bird survey services under Contract No. 30001693 (effective July 1, 2010 with an expiration date of June 30, 2013). This ordinance is to amend the contract to extend the duration of bird surveys through June 30, 2016.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The cost of this contract amendment is \$20,290 over three fiscal years (July 2013 through June 2016). Funds are available in the Watershed Services Operating Fund, FY 2013-2014 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Cost Centers ESWS000006 and ESWS000011.

In addition, there is a great deal of citizen participation in invasive plant removal and native planting at two of the projects at which bird surveys are conducted: Mt. Tabor and White Oak habitat areas.
