7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The purpose of this legislation is to authorize alternative holiday pay for Headworks Water Treatment Operators on Day 1 Shift, Day 2 Shift, Night 1 Shift and Night 2 Shift (collectively referred to as "Shift WTOs"). The Shift WTOs work a bi-weekly rotation of three 12.25 hour work days, two days off, one 12.25 hour work day, one 6.50 hour work day, three days off, and two 12.25 hour work days. The 6.50 hour work day always falls on a Thursday. When a holiday falls on a Thursday or Friday, and that holiday is observed on Thursday for one set of the Day Shift and Night Shift WTOs referenced above, those Shift WTOs only receive 6.50 hours of holiday pay and compensation for hours worked on Thursday as stated in Article 15.2, which is less than the other set of Day Shift and Night Shift Water Treatment Operators who do not work the Thursday on which the holiday is observed. The City and AFSCME, Local 189-1 has entered into a Letter of Agreement (LOA) that authorizes alternative holiday pay for Shift WTOs who are assigned to the Day 1, Day 2, Night 1, and Night 2 shifts. Under the LOA, when a holiday falls on or is observed on a Thursday, employees assigned to the shifts listed above shall observe the holiday on the following Monday. As a result, employees shall receive 12.25 hours of holiday pay instead of 6.5 hours of holiday pay. The LOA is effective November 3, 2010 to June 30, 2013.



8. FINANCIAL IMPACT
