The City of Portland consolidated the housing functions that existed at the City and PDC through Ordinance No. 182465 on January 7, 2009, and established the Portland Housing Bureau (PHB). The transition of housing functions to PHB from PDC was implemented based upon Ordinance 183903 passed June 16, 2010, to better coordinate housing activities in the City of Portland. The two IGAs are necessary to carry out housing functions at PHB, and enable the PHB to receive reimbursement of TIF expenditures. These agreements are not controversial, and the process to develop them has been collaborative with PDC staff and legal and City staff and legal. This ordinance will approve the IGA's for the third year of this working arrangement.
