The upgrade of six Police vehicles is estimated to cost the Police Bureau \$80,553.96. CityFleet has budgeted in FY 2013-14 capital replacement budget for the replacement of these vehicles and the Police Bureau will fund the upgrade from sedans to SUV's. There is no estimated increase in ongoing operations or maintenance for these replacement vehicles for the Police Bureau.

The cost to delay this purchase could be significant. The officers with K-9 sedans are restricted to carrying a limited amount of equipment. The SUV has a larger capacity to equip the officers with all the gear necessary to keep them safe.

The Police Bureau is requesting to upgrade six vehicles from K-9 sedans to K-9 SUV's. These SUV's will have larger interiors, increased functionality, and the ability to transport heavy payloads. The officers with K-9 sedans were restricted to carrying a limited amount of equipment. The larger SUV capacity they will be able to carry all the gear necessary to keep K-9 officers and the officers safe. The climate controlled cabin area will also keep expensive equipment from being damaged by moisture which is common in trunk space, especially during inclement weather conditions.
