Schools involved throughout the design phase of this project were: The Madeleine School and Alameda School (see 9c). The first phase of this project is currently under construction.

I. RECOMMENDATION

Authorize a contract for construction of the Vernon-Sabin-lameda Phase 2 Sewer Rehabilitation Project, BES Project No E10379 for \$3,100,000. (Ordinance)

II. BACKGROUND

The Vernon-Sabin-Alameda Phase 2 Sewer Rehabilitation Project is one of the BES Maintenance and Reliability "Structural Rehabilitation of Combined and Sanitary Sewers" projects. This project is located in NE Portland and is bounded by NE Alameda St to the north, NE Siskiyou St to the south, NE 20th Ave to the west, and NE 31st Ave to the east. The first phase of this project is currently under construction.

The purpose of this project will be to construct approximately 10,030 feet of 12 inch to 15 inch combined sewer pipe using open-cut construction method. This project will also construct 62 manholes, 38 stormwater inlets, approximately 3,870 feet of service laterals, and 955 feet of inlet pipe. The existing sewers are seriously deteriorated and their failure will compromise the health and safety of the residents.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The engineer's estimate for the construction contract is \$3,100,000. The level of confidence in this estimate is high. Funds are available in the Bureau of Environmental Services Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2014. WBS E10379.C60.

This project allows BES to continue to effectively operate the public sewer system. Repair and rehabilitation of public sewer is consistent with BES' Mission and City sewer policies: BES protects public health, water quality and the environment. BES provides sewage and stormwater collection services to accommodate future needs.
