A onetime application fee of \$250 for first time applicants has been historically collected by Bureau of Public Services and will continue to be collected by PHB. A \$50 fee is collected for each subsequent year's application. Annual approximate revenue of \$2,700 is projected.

There is no fiscal impact to the Portland Housing Bureau itself. The City of Portland will forego a projected \$2,610,790; however, this non-profit property tax exemption program has been in place since 1985 and can be found in the 2011-12 Annual Report Residential Tax Exemption Programs. <u>http://www.portlandoregon.gov/phb/article/439738</u>. Presumably, the General Fund forecasting model already accounts for the continuation of this program.
