A magnificent view of the city and the Cascade mountains.

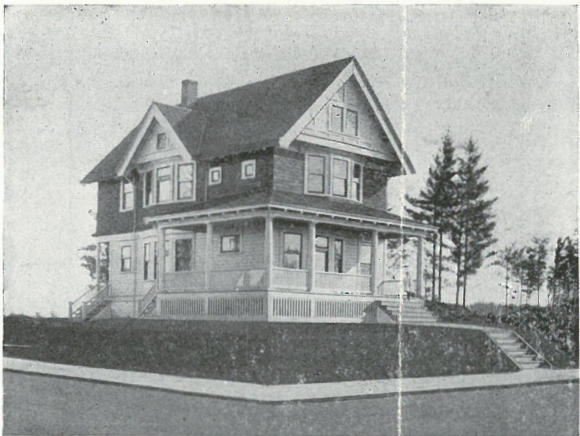

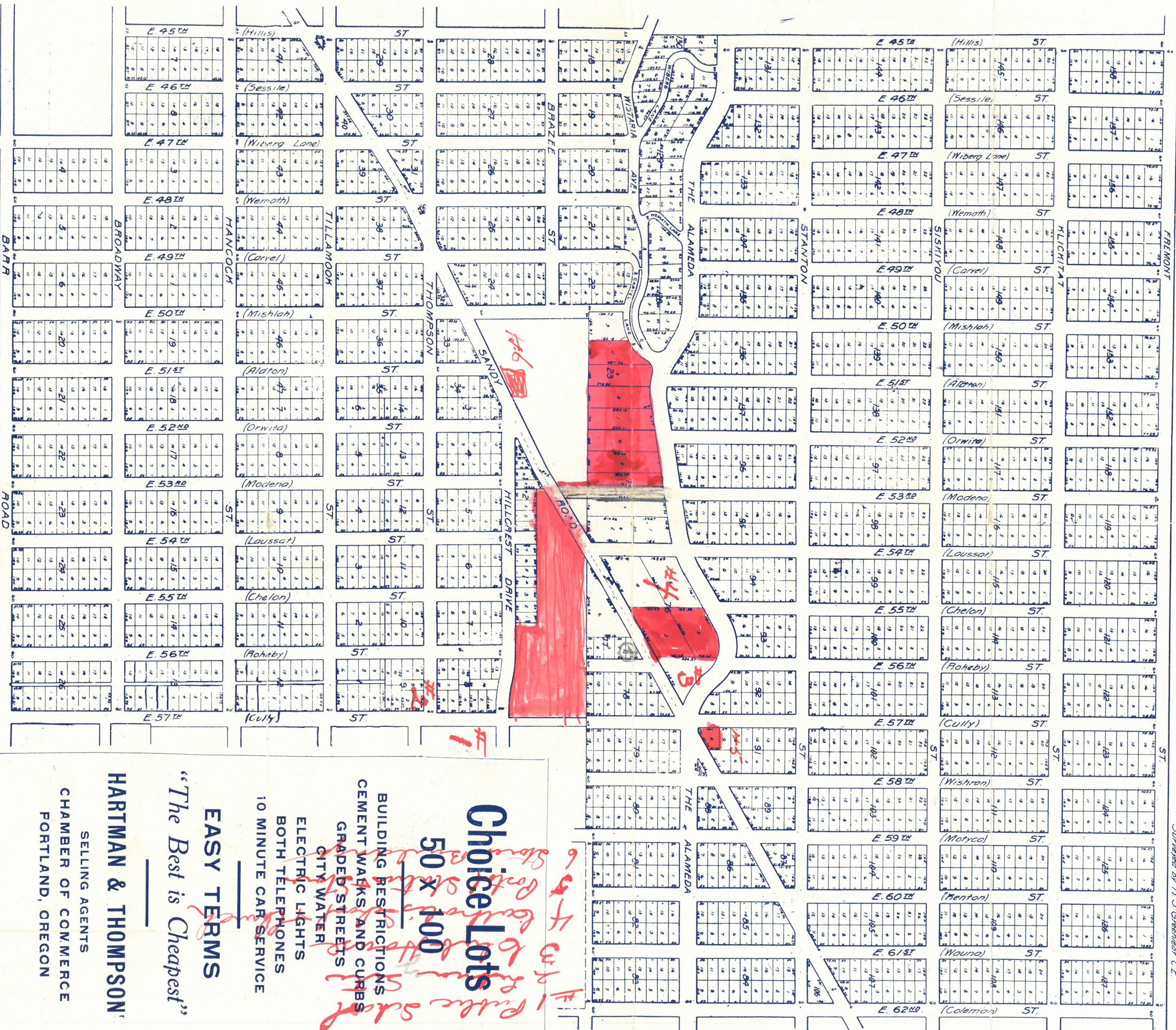
