4. History of Agenda Item/Background:

In early 2011, the City identified a portion of a retaining wall on the northwesterly side of SW Fairview Blvd as needing replacement due to an unstable slope. The City and the adjacent property owner developed a public-private partnership in which the property owner agreed to replace the entire failing wall with a new engineered structure on both private and public property, and the City would sponsor this street vacation so that the new wall would be privately owned and maintained. The City also agreed to replace the adjoining sidewalk which had been damaged by movement of the wall and slope.

Therefore, the Bureau of Transportation initiated a vacation of a portion of SW Fairview Boulevard at SW Champlain Drive on September 7, 2011. The proposed vacation is depicted on Exhibit 1 attached hereto.

Comments were solicited from City Bureaus, government agencies, public utilities and affected neighborhood associations. No substantive objections were received. The Planning and Sustainability Commission reviewed and approved the proposed street vacation on February 14, 2012.

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An Engineer's Report was completed on June 20, 2013, recommending approval of the street vacation, subject to certain conditions and reservations. The Report, inclusive of the Planning and Sustainability Commission recommendation, will be forwarded to your office under separate cover, along with a recommended Street Vacation Ordinance for consideration by City Council.

ORS 271.120 requires that a public hearing be held prior to City Council taking action on the street vacation request. This memo is to serve as a formal request to schedule the required public meeting. The Office of the City Auditor will publish and post notice of the scheduled public hearing. The public notice will provide information on how to obtain information about the proposed street vacation, including copies of the Engineer's Report and Planning and Sustainability Commission Recommendation.

5. Purpose of Agenda Item:

The purpose of this request is to schedule a public hearing for consideration of the proposed street vacation request.

7. What Individuals or Groups Are or Would Be Opposed to This Ordinance?

No opposition to this street vacation request is expected.

Inquiries were received from representatives of the Arlington Heights Neighborhood Association and Neighbors West / Northwest. The questions were answered satisfactorily by PBOT staff. During conversations with PBOT staff, the representatives of the Arlington Heights Neighborhood Association and Neighbors West / Northwest were generally supportive of the request, but to PBOT's knowledge, the groups did not take an official position on the project.

PBOT staff is supportive of this street vacation request.

Comments were solicited from affected neighborhood associations and public utilities.
