9. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The Portland Police Bureau's Prostitution Coordination Team (PCT) is a program designed to reduce crime and improve the lives of people caught in the cycle of addiction and criminality. This comprehensive strategy combines resources from the Portland Police Bureau, the Multnomah County District Attorney's office, and treatment providers.

The PCT has added services and strategies to help sex workers seek alternative means of support and/or to address any drug, alcohol, or other issues. The PCT's efforts extend to both adult and underage sex workers. This program seeks to balance the need for protective services, enforcing laws, and addressing root causes of criminal behavior.

In 1997, LifeWorks Northwest began providing services specifically designed to meet the needs of prostituted women. Since that time, the New Options for Women program has been the identified provider for this population in Multnomah County and helps an average of 100 women and girls each year. Qualified staff members, consisting mostly of women, are adept at assessing and addressing clients' mental health, addiction, community services and safety needs. LifeWorks Northwest has been working with the Portland Police Bureau to serve this population as part of the Prostitution Coordination Team.

This contract amendment will allow LifeWorks Northwest to continue working in conjunction with the PCT to reduce crime and improve the lives of people caught in the cycle of addiction and criminality.

This contract amendment will also begin requiring Lifeworks Northwest to report quarterly on the NOW program administrative costs, overall costs, demographics, and post-program participant behavior. In addition, Lifeworks will provide a narrative summary of the program every six months.

The City will fund the project partially with grant from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance FY13 Justice Assistance Grant Program, and a one-time General Fund appropriation allocated in the FY2013-14 Police Bureau Budget.
