## 9. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) notified the Police Bureau that it will award a grant for the 2013 Speed Program in the amount of \$20,000. The grant period is June 18, 2013, through September 30, 2013.

The ODOT Speed Grant will fund overtime for the Police Bureau Traffic Division to examine the areas in which traffic accidents are speed-related. Reductions in crashes may be accomplished by enhancing the driver's perceived risk of a citation on a given roadway with multi-unit enforcement visibility in a consistent, focused, rotating enforcement pattern on different roadways. This program will allow the bureau to focus multi-unit enforcement tactics on locations with the greatest occurrence of speed-involved crashes.

### **Grant Program Objectives**

• To reduce serious injury crashes and fatalities due to speed in Portland

There are no legal or controversial issues. There is no voluntary citizen participation. There are no links to current City policies. No other government agencies participate in Portland's program.
