9. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Entertainment Detail officers have been presenting a PowerPoint training to staff at bars and nightclubs since 2012 in order to educate alcohol-serving establishments to mitigate over-service issues. Until recently the Entertainment Detail officers were presenting these trainings on an overtime hour's basis paid by the Portland Police Bureau. With relationships developed with the Multnomah County Department of Human Services Mental Health and Addiction Services Division, their office has secured grant funding to pay for the overtime costs associated with training sessions for Fiscal Year 2013-14.

Additionally, the agreement proposes the Entertainment Detail officers conduct plainclothes missions focusing on over-service. The missions would be staffed with two Entertainment Detail officers working in plainclothes during peak business hours of bars, nightclubs, events, and other establishments where alcohol is served. The agreement would pay the overtime costs for uniform officers to backfill the routine uniform patrol responsibilities in the absence of the Entertainment Detail officers.

The proposed agreement provides \$15,000 through June 30, 2014 to reimburse overtime expenses for these services.

10. FINANCIAL IMPACT & PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

The maximum compensation amount of the contract is \$15,000 through the contract period July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014.
