A. Provide information about the item (What is it about? Why is it important? Is there anything controversial? If so, why is it controversial and how is the controversy addressed? Any pertinent background information?)

This agenda item is to authorize the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) to apply for a \$279,486 State Homeland Security grant through the Oregon Office of Emergency Management. If awarded, this grant would provide bridge funding to support core programs and initiatives in light of the loss of federal Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) funding for FY 2013. PBEM has received UASI funding annually since 2003 to support many of its disaster preparedness efforts. Earlier this year, the federal Department of Homeland Security determined through a risk analysis process that the Portland Urban Area (PUA) will not be eligible for FY 2013 UASI funds. PBEM and partner jurisdictions in the region are looking to the State Homeland Security Grant Program to sustain core emergency preparedness planning processes, trainings, programs, and equipment while additional funding sources are identified.

- B. Provide three points of information that our Commissioner can use to introduce this item
 - 1. PBEM's application for a State Homeland Security grant will sustain critical disaster preparedness capabilities not just in Portland but across the region, particularly by supporting the Regional Disaster Preparedness Organization (RDPO).
 - 2. The grant would provide bridge funding while PBEM and regional partners identify long-term funding mechanisms to support these disaster relief efforts in light of the loss of federal Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) funding in FY 2013.
 - 3. Of particular importance in this grant application is funding for WebEOC, a crisis information management tool, the community emergency notification system, as well as training for emergency preparedness programs that enhance community resilience.
