ORDINANCE No. 186250

*Authorize charitable organizations eligible to participate in the City 2014 Charitable Campaign and authorize exemptions from umbrella requirement for Portland Parks Foundation and for Portland Toy & Joymakers (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Ordinance No. 161964, adopted by Council on May 24, 1989, established standards and guidelines for conducting charitable fund-raising campaigns and authorized the use of the payroll deduction system for making donations to charities.
- 2. The 15 agencies and foundations listed below are being recommended to participate in the 2014 Charitable Campaign.
- 3. Portland Toy & Joymakers and Portland Parks Foundation have participated in past City Charitable Campaigns but do not disburse funds to nine member Charitable Organizations and thus do not conform with City Code Section 5.10.010B.
- 4. Both Portland Toy & Joymakers and Portland Parks Foundation have a long and commendable history of providing charitable works for the citizens of the City of Portland and have participated in the City Charitable Campaign for a number of years.
- 5. The City's Charitable Campaign Advisory Committee recommends to the City Council that Portland Toy & Joymakers and Portland Parks Foundation be allowed to continue to participate in the City's annual Charitable Campaign, notwithstanding the requirements of City Code Section 5.10.010B.
- 6. All other participating agencies have met the Code requirements outlined in Section 5.10. The City's Charitable Campaign Advisory Committee recommends that Council approve the participation of these organizations in the 2014 Campaign.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. Council approves the exemption from the umbrella organization requirement for Portland Toy & Joymakers and Portland Parks Foundation.
- b. The following umbrella organizations and their member organizations are eligible to participate in the City's 2014 Charitable Campaign.
 - All Hands Raised (formerly Portland Schools Foundation)
 - America's Charities
 - Black United Fund of Oregon
 - Children's Trust Fund of Oregon
 - Community Health Charities of Oregon
