Sir,

Now that you have taken up the reins of city government, I am constrained to address you on a subject which I think will interest you.

While living in Glasgow, Scotland 1879-82 I had the pleasure of becoming acquainted with Mr. McCall, then Superintendent of the City Police. He inaugurated a system of inspection of public houses or saloons where spirituous liquors were sold, which I think would fit the present situation in Portland.

A plan was taken of all these premises, showing interior arrangements and all openings, (doors, windows and cellar-way) with location. These were placed in a register, for the purpose, and properly indexed for quick reference. Any public-house in Glasgow could be thoroughly guarded and searched without allowing any to escape, at any time and on the shortest notice. The system proved of great importance in running down criminals, and brought the escapes down to a minimum. I understand it is now generally adopted.

I shall be pleased to talk with you on the matter and give you all the information I possess in regard to its operation.
