a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

The construction of the project will be staged to maintain two-way traffic through the project area on N Burgard Rd for the duration of construction. Minimal to no traffic impact is anticipated for the traveling public. Construction of additional sidewalk improvement is expected to increase pedestrian safety within the project area.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

PBOT had met and collaborated with business owners in the project area (including Port of Portland, Schnitzer Steel, Northwest Container Services and Waste Express) to coordinate design issues and their effect on business operations. PBOT had also been working through the Portland Freight Committee to disseminate information regarding the project to the freight community.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

The project is tailored to address the concerns of business and neighborhood groups in the St. Johns community by enabling non-local and industrial traffic to be routed along the edges of residential areas both during and subsequent to construction.
