Authorize City Attorney to join brief of *amicus curiae* City and County of San Francisco, in *McCullen v. Coakley* (Resolution).

WHEREAS, It is the policy of the City of Portland to support a woman's reproductive rights, including the right to choose, seek and obtain services related to pregnancy and abortion without interference and with respect for her right of privacy, and

WHEREAS, The City of Portland recognizes that many people conscientiously oppose abortion rights, and that opponents of legal abortion have the right under the Oregon and United States constitutions to speak freely and to advocate zealously regarding their views, and

WHEREAS, The burden of trying to protect the competing rights of reproductive clinic patients and anti-abortion protestors frequently falls on local government, and

WHEREAS, The United States Supreme Court, in *McCullen v. Coakley*, Docket No. 12-1168, is considering the constitutionality of a Massachusetts statute intended to preserve free access to reproductive rights clinics by limiting how close other people, including anti-abortion protestors, may come to patients entering and leaving such clinics, and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco intends to file a brief as *amicus curiae* in support of the constitutionality of the statute and has asked the City of Portland to join in the brief, and

WHEREAS, The impact of the decision in *McCullen v. Coakley* is likely to reach beyond the context of abortion protests, and is likely to impact how the City of Portland is able to manage use of and access to its public places and rights of way,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Attorney or his designee is authorized to appear, on behalf of the City of Portland, as *amicus curiae* in *McCullen v. Coakley*, and to join in the brief of the City and County of San Francisco, and may take any and all appropriate legal steps as in his judgment may be necessary to such appearance.
