



Susan Emmons and Northwest Pilot Project

Northwest Pilot Project (NWPP) is a nonprofit social service agency serving the housing needs of low income older adults age 55+ throughout Multnomah County. The agency helps its clientele with finding and retaining affordable housing. Northwest Pilot Project advocates for increasing the affordable housing supply to ensure everyone in our community has the opportunity to have a decent and affordable home.

Susan Emmons joined the staff of Northwest Pilot Project in 1985 and became its Executive Director in 1987. Prior to this, Ms. Emmons served as Secretary/Office Manager of First Congregational Church for 7 years. Northwest Pilot Project is located in downtown Portland, has 14 staff members, an active Board of Directors, and over 200 volunteers. The Project publishes an annual inventory of affordable housing that is widely used. NWPP continues to lead successful advocacy efforts to preserve low-income housing, and increase the stock of affordable housing for homeless and very low income people.

Northwest Pilot Project began 44 years ago through the visionary leadership of the Reverend Peter Paulson, a member of First Congregational Church. The agency's original focus was on elderly residents living alone in "SRO" (single room occupancy) apartments in the inner city. Today the agency touches the lives of 3,000 people each year. Its mission is to offer opportunites for a life of dignity and hope to elderly, disabled, poor and homeless people downtown Portland, with in the doal to end homelessness of seniors living in Multnomah County and to foster long term housing stability. During the past year, NWPP helped 594 seniors to find and maintain permanent housing. A central concern of NWPP is to help people direct their own lives and provide continuing support for their self-reliance.

The Helen, Egbert and Marguerite Oliver Lecture

In 1977, following the death of his wife Helen (1902-77), Dr. Egbert Oliver (1902-89) established a perpetual fund in First Congregational United Church of Christ of Portland, for a Helen Oliver memorial lectureship. Since 1978 it has been an annual event "related to the Christian world mission and our commitment to it. Subjects may include examination of a broad range of current public issues as well as the church's life and organization and its relationship with other religious and secular institutions and movements."

Dr. Oliver married Marguerite Reese in 1979. Following his death in 1989 the church renamed the event the Helen and Egbert Oliver Memorial Lecture. Until her death, this past July, Marguerite Oliver was an avid and interested participant in planning and hosting the event. In her honor, henceforth the name is The Helen, Egbert and Marguerite Oliver Lecture.

The most recent lecture, on February 29, 2012, was presented by Dr. F.W. de Klerk, former President of the Republic of South Africa, and co-recipient of the Nobel Peace prize with Nelson Mandela. A list of all the former lecturers is available upon request to the church office.

The 2013 Oliver Lecture Committee is comprised of Suzanne Mattox, Don Sevetson, and Assistant Minister Reverend Sara Rosenau.
