

## ORDINANCE No. 186334

Extend term of a temporary, revocable permit granted to Portland State University for electric vehicle supply equipment services (Ordinance; amend Ordinance No. 184805)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. In August 2011, the City Council granted a 30 month temporary, revocable permit to Portland State University (PSU), to use the City streets to provide electric vehicle supply equipment services through February 2014. Ordinance No. 184805. PSU filed an acceptance of the temporary, revocable permit in September 2011. The temporary, revocable permit allowed PSU, with its partners, Portland General Electric and the City of Portland, to transform a block of SW Montgomery Street into "Electric Avenue" and to showcase a variety of electric vehicle charging stations.
2. PSU submitted a written request to extend the term of the permit through February 28, 2015. A copy of PSU's letter is attached to this Ordinance as Exhibit A and is hereby incorporated by reference. An extension would allow PSU to integrate new products into the project and to transition to other charging stations for evaluation. Electric Avenue will continue to provide valuable research in this developing industry.
3. City staff recommends that the City Council extend the existing temporary, revocable permit.


NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. Ordinance No. 184805 is hereby amended to extend the term of the temporary, revocable permit, continuously and without interruption, to February 28, 2015.
- b. All other terms and conditions of the temporary, revocable permit shall remain the same and unchanged.
- c. On or before the thirtieth (30th) day after this ordinance becomes effective, Portland State University shall file in the Office of the Auditor of the City of Portland a written acceptance of this ordinance, executed by Portland State University meeting the approval of the City Attorney. Any failure on the part of Portland State University to file such written acceptance within such time shall be deemed an abandonment and rejection of this ordinance, and shall be construed to be an acceptance of all the terms contained in this ordinance.
