Accepting the grant will generate \$200,000 in grant revenue that will be passed on to the Washington Park Transportation Association (WP-TMA). WP-TMA was authorized by the Portland City Council in the 2012 Washington Park Transportation Parking and Management Agreement (Ordinance 185779).

Accepting the grant will create \$200,000 in expenses in the form of a pass through grant to WP-TMA. Minor expenses will be expended by PP&R to monitor grant related spending and project progress.

There is a 10.27 % match requirement for this federally-funded grant opportunity. PP&R anticipates a match of \$750,000 over two years (representing a 78.95% match for the total project cost.) The WP-TMA is a new non-profit funded by revenue generated from the new payto-park system. Match funding will be provided by pay-to-park revenue. This funding was authorized by the Portland City Council in the 2012 Washington Park Transportation Parking and Management Agreement (Ordinance 185779).
