ORDINANCE No. 186364 As Amended

Amend the FY 2013-14 budget to include appropriations for funds to address human trafficking (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. At least 469 children were exploited as commercial sex workers in Portland between 2009 and 2013, according to a 2013 study by Portland State University commissioned by US Attorney Amanda Marshall.
- 2. Twenty seven percent (27%) of the exploited children were African-American, a percentage five times greater than the percentage of African Americans in Multnomah County.
- 3. Portland has received national attention as a hub for human trafficking. Many more women, men, and transgender individuals over the age of 18 are forced into prostitution.
- 4. Nearly 1 in 25 men in Portland solicited sex for pay online in a 24 hour period, according to a 2013 Arizona State University study.
- 5. Portland was ranked second in the nation in rescued child survivors of human trafficking, according to a 2010 study highlighted by, Dan Rather on 60 minutes.
- 6. The Janus Youth Services staff estimates that for every young survivor they serve, ten more victims remain on the streets due to lack of services.
- 7. The City of Portland cut funding for services to victims of human trafficking by \$117,000 in the FY 2013-14 Adopted Budget.
- 8. Since adoption of the FY 2013-14 Budget, additional one-time resources have been identified, much due to cost-cutting by City bureaus.
- 9. Of the many life-and-death needs in Portland, assistance to youth and young adults age 18 25 wishing to escape from the slavery of human trafficking is among the most urgent.
- 10. Providers report that both boys and girls are entering the path to sexual exploitation as early as middle school. Additional education targeted to vulnerable populations in high-risk middle schools would provide children with the training they need to promote healthy behavior and reduce the risk of human trafficking.

NOW, THEREFORE the Council directs:

a. The FY 2013-14 Appropriation Schedule is amended to include appropriation authority for the programs outlined in Exhibits A, B, and C attached.
