a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

This project will directly affect approximately 143 households in the Eastmoreland and Woodstock neighborhoods that front the proposed construction and are connected to the affected sewers. These project neighbors will experience construction noise and general disturbance on their streets while work occurs in front of their homes and on their block. For households directly fronting the work sites, there may be brief periods of sewer and water interruption and brief periods of driveway access delay. If necessary, such interruptions will be carefully managed and residents notified in advance.

The project as a whole, will affect the Eastmoreland and Woodstock Neighborhoods with intermittent traffic delays. No impacts are anticipated for Reed College, Woodstock Elementary, Our Lady of Sorrows Elementary, Lents Education Center, Lewis Elementary, Duniway Elementary, Holy Family School, Whole Child Montessori Center or Berkeley Park.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State of Oregon as minority, women, and emerging small businesses. They became involved when the project advertised for bids on July 24, 2013.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Bids received resulted in the award of the construction contract.

d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

Procurement Services advertised the project for bids and held the prebid meeting that was open to the construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State as minority, women, and emerging small businesses.

- 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 186089 adopted June 12, 2013 authorized a contract and provided for payment for the Eastmoreland-Woodstock Sewer Rehabilitation Project. The purpose of this project will be to construct approximately 35,500 feet of public combined and sanitary sewer in the Eastmoreland-Woodstock neighborhoods which are severely deteriorated and need to be replaced.
- 8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT:</u> The engineer's estimate for this project was \$12,000,000.00 and the confidence level was high. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2013 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, WBS Element E10269.C60.
- 9. **RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED:** Accept Recommendation to award contract to Moore Excavation, Inc. in the amount of \$9,672,115.00.
- 10. <u>SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT:</u> The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and supervision necessary to construct approximately 35,000 linear feet of small to medium diameter public sewer, primarily using open cut construction

methods. 120 manholes will be replaced and approximately 743 sewer laterals will be replaced.
