Survivors will have more options empowering them to escape human trafficking, which will reduce the number of people engaged in prostitution areas such as 82nd Avenue.

Dozens of individuals and groups testified during the spring of 2013, advocating for more funding during the City Budget process. Provider groups and leaders in addressing human trafficking, including the Portland Police Bureau and the Human Rights Commission, participated in a Task Force meeting convened by City Commissioner Amanda Fritz and County Commissioner Diane McKeel, to propose the most urgent actions that will address both immediate and long term needs on this issue. Commissioner Fritz then refined the proposals working with providers of the services identified as most crucial.
