a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

The City's 2014 Federal Legislative Agenda is focused on environmental clean-up, transportation infrastructure, education, public safety, economic development, development of public parks, as well as other City needs. Successful implementation of the Federal Legislative Agenda will positively impact Portland residents by improving public safety, neighborhood livability, and budget stability for critical public services.

# b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The City held a publicized public comment period in the fall of 2013 for the development of the 2014 State and Federal Legislative Agendas. From October 21 to November 8, members of the public submitted comments to the office of the Mayor via phone and email to identify critical issues to their neighborhoods and communities for consideration as part of the City's State and Federal Legislative Agendas. Notice of the opportunity for comment was posted on the Office of Neighborhood Involvement website and sent to a broad range of community members including representatives of neighborhood associations and coalitions, non-profit organizations (including those who serve underrepresented communities), business associations, local legislators, and individuals who attended forums that informed the development of the City's 2013 State and Federal Legislative Agenda.

Additionally, the Office of Neighborhood Involvement and Government Relations hosted an "Advocacy 101" event on Tuesday, January 14<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. "Advocacy 101" previewed the 2014 legislative session and provide community members with tips on how to be effective advocates for their community or neighborhood during this upcoming legislative session beginning in February. A panel comprised of state legislators, federal delegation staff, and a community activist shared their perspectives and answered questions about how the community can make an impact on public policy.

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### c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Community members provided the City with input on issues to include in 2014 State and Federal Legislative Agendas. Government Relations compiled input from citizens and distributed the information to Council Offices for their review and consideration.

Mayor Hales approved the community engagement strategy that was collaboratively designed and implemented by the Office of Neighborhood Involvement and Office of Government Relations.
