- 5. Purpose of Agenda Item: To authorize an IGA that accepts funds from Metro to support educational programs provided by Bureau of Planning and Sustainability as part of its Green Building Program.
- 6. History of Agenda Item/Background: The City of Portland Bureau of Planning and Sustainability's Green Building Program has developed two popular educational events for the region's residential and commercial contractors. Both the Green Spot pilot and a Deconstruction Demonstration Workshop educate construction industry professionals on green building and remodeling practices, including the salvage and recycling of building materials. Because these events are consistent with Sustainability Center's objectives in the area of construction and demolition debris recycling programs and the C&D waste reduction initiative, Metro has agreed to cosponsor these events.
