  - a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

Some minor traffic delays and temporary loss of parking will occur on SE 130th Avenues during the active construction period. Every effort will be made to minimize those impacts by following the traffic control plan developed specifically for this project. City Project Manager will communicate the schedule and impacts to neighborhood associations, businesses and all affected property owners during construction.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

Public notification will happen approximately 3 weeks prior to construction. Mailers will be sent to all residents and businesses along each route notifying them of the anticipated construction schedule, any traffic control and parking impacts, and what to expect to see during construction. Franchise utilities, TriMet and the Bike Advisory Group will also be notified of the upcoming projects. PBOT also coordinates business and resident access and all other issues through phone contact and website display during construction. Construction and scheduling information will also be sent to adjacent neighborhood associations. Along SE 130<sup>th</sup> Ave, an open house was held notifying residents of on-street parking removal to allow the installation of new bike lanes. An additional outreach meeting will be held on February 21st with David Douglas School to finalize the bikeway design. Council authorization of this ordinance will not preclude adding or removing bike lanes and/or on-street parking on SE 130<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Public involvement along SE 130<sup>th</sup> will shape the outcome of the proposed bikeway design and whether or not parking will be removed for the bike facility.
