The Human Rights Commission (HRC) is seeking Council confirmation for a new commissioner to fill a vacant seat with a term that will expire October 31, 2016. I am recommending appointment for Kate Lore.

Appointment:

Rev. Kate Lore serves as the Social Justice Minister at First Unitarian Church, where she has worked since 1998. She is an active member of the Albina Ministerial Alliance (AMA) Coalition for Justice & Police, the Jobs with Justice Worker's Right Board, and RaceTalks. She has received several community awards for her work, including the 2013 NAACP Women's Leadership Award, the 2013 Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon Award for Justice, and the 2012 Achievement Award from Portland's Coordinating Committee to End Homelessness.

With this proposed appointment, the Human Rights Commission will have one vacancy to be filled in March. Commissioner Donita Fry has announced her intention to resign from HRC. Rev. Lore will be taking Commissioner John Verssue's seat as he has resigned to find employment outside of Portland. I have included an updated Human Rights Commission membership list for your records.
