a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

None.

This item is for temporary construction easements and a permit of entry for a portion of the Sellwood-Moreland Sewer Rehabilitation Project. The sewer project has enacted a Public Involvement Program that engaged the neighborhood throughout the design process.

The proposed work within the Waverley Country Club has been scheduled and conditioned to minimize disruption of Waverley activities. Construction will temporarily block use of some fairways and will create intermittent truck traffic along the golf course asphalt paths. No extended impacts are anticipated.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

Beginning in January 2013 through the present, Environmental Services conducted extensive community outreach to neighborhood and business associations, schools, parks, property owners and occupants who may be impacted by sewer construction. The city also worked directly with individual property owners including the Waverley Country Club.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Extensive outreach to and involvement of the Waverley Country Club resulted in agreements regarding construction schedule, access and restoration on the golf course.
