Women Into Housing Now (WIHN)

This one-time \$300k City General Fund (GF) investment focuses on housing placement for women experiencing homelessness, including those in couples or families. Flexible rent assistance will support women to find permanent housing, resulting in reduced shelter waitlists and more women who are diverted from entering shelter. Contract Period: October 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014.
