ORDINANCE No. 186535

*Authorize application to Oregon Department of Transportation/Compressed Natural Gas Infrastructure 2014 Call for Projects for a grant up to the amount of \$4,000,000 for Columbia Blvd Wastewater Treatment Plant Biogas Utilization (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Sustainable governmental operations and efficient energy utilization are important to the City of Portland.
- 2. The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) operates and maintains the Columbia Boulevard Wastewater Treatment Plant (CBWTP). A byproduct of the wastewater treatment process is biogas. Currently 80% of this biogas is reused and 20% of the biogas is flared.
- 3. BES recently retained a consultant to analyze five alternatives to beneficially reuse the flared biogas. The recommended alternative involves design and construction of a gas treatment facility that converts biogas into compressed natural gas (CNG) for use in vehicles, a gas storage facility and CNG fueling stations.
- 4. ODOT, through federal Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) funds for clean technologies in Oregon, is accepting proposals for the installation of natural gas fueling stations. BES is preparing a grant application to submit to ODOT, requesting funds up to the amount of \$4,000,000.
- 5. If a grant is awarded to the City, Council approval of local match in the amount of \$2,700,000 will be sought. Local match will be provided in the form of salary, benefits and external services in the FY 2014/15 requested budget and FY 2015/16 and 2016/17 proposed budgets of the Bureau of Environmental Services. Matching funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, Bureau of Environmental Services, WBS element E10033.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make an application to ODOT for a grant up to the amount of \$4,000,000.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.

- c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists since the application must be delivered by April 2014. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
