ORDINANCE No. REFERRED TO COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC UTILITIES

*Authorize Procurement Services to enter into a contract for construction and payment of E. Delta Park Synthetic Turf Fields (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Portland Parks and Recreation ("PP&R" or the "City") owns Delta Park which includes seven softball fields, one all-weather synthetic sports field and eight grass sports fields.
- 2. PP&R's 2020 Vision Plan (the "Vision") for Delta Park contemplates converting the existing grass sport fields to all-weather synthetic sport fields and the addition of field lights.
- 3. The City recognizes the significance of Delta Park as a regional sports facility, contributing to the vitality of the community and economy. Over the years, Delta Park has experienced increasing demand for its use by sport field users.
- 4. Ordinance No. 186266 approved September 25, 2013 authorized PP&R to fund improvements to Delta Park comprised of the Fields Project described above in partnership with Peregrine Sports, LLC.
- As a result, PP&R, consistent with the Vision, plans to solicit competitive bids for the conversion of four of the grass sport fields to all-weather synthetic sports fields.
- 6. Parks will be the lead contracting agency for the project and will advertise, award and manage the construction contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Council Directs:

- a. The Purchasing Agent is authorized to negotiate and execute a contract for two synthetic turf fields at E. Delta Park to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, provided the contract has been approved as to form by the City Attorney's office. The Purchasing Agent is also authorized to add two additional fields if funding is available.
- b. The Auditor is authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to P10435 when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
- c. In accepting responsibility for the new improvements, the Council previously acknowledged the need to fund the annual on-going maintenance costs estimated at \$107,500 per year. Parks requests that OMF include this funding in its five-year forecast for the fiscal year 2014/2015 going forward.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists in order to avoid further delay in executing the construction contract, which would adversely impact the City's ability to meet the schedule for the improvement project; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
