ORDINANCE NO. 186549

* Authorize application to the Department of Homeland Security, through its Federal Emergency Management Agency for a grant totaling \$1,900,000 to replace the Station 6 pier and dock and construct a boathouse for the David Campbell Fireboat. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Department of Homeland Security, through its Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has offered the Port Security Grant Program since 2002. The grant funds are intended to support increased port-wide risk management; enhanced domain awareness; training and exercises; expansion of port recovery and resiliency capabilities; and further capabilities to prevent, detect, respond to, and recover from attacks involving improvised explosive devices and other non-conventional weapons.
- 2. Portland Fire & Rescue (PF&R) responds to emergency incidents along 149 miles of navigable waterways of the Columbia and Willamette Rivers. It works collaboratively with many city, county, state and federal jurisdictions on both sides of the rivers to ensure the metropolitan area waterways are adequately protected.
- 3. Project #1: Station 6 pier/dock replacement with enhanced security
 - Using funds from the 2010 Public Safety General Obligation Bond, PF&R is having a Type III Rapid Response Fireboat built that will be located at Station 6 in the Northwest Industrial area located less than three miles from the downtown core area.
 - The pier at Station 6 was originally built in the 1950's using creosoted material that is harmful to the environment, has significant deterioration causing safety issues and needs to be replaced.
 - Security features for the Station 6 pier are minimal and will not be sufficient to secure the new Rapid Response Fireboat.
 - The Northwest Industrial waterway is bordered by a rail line that is expected to have an increase in Bakken crude tanker shipments. A new pier/dock will enable PF&R to securely and rapidly deploy booming materials necessary in the event of a rail incident.
 - The cost to replace the pier/dock and include enhanced security features is \$1,200,000.
 - The grant request will be \$900,000 and the 25% match will be \$300,000.

- 4. Project #2: Boathouse for the David Campbell Fireboat
 - The boathouse for the David Campbell Fireboat was purchased as a used structure and is no longer adequate to provide shelter and security for the Campbell which will be relocated at the highly visible Station 21.
 - The cost to build a new Campbell boathouse is \$1,350,000.
 - The grant request will be \$1,000,000 and the 25% match for this project will be \$333,333.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency for a grant in the amount of \$1,900,000.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists in that any delay in the application for this grant will result in losing the opportunity for funding these activities; therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
