TRN-10.06 - Street Closure Permits for Community Events and Block Parties

STREET CLOSURE PERMITS FOR COMMUNITY EVENTS AND BLOCK PARTIES

Administrative Rule Adopted by Bureau of Transportation Engineering Pursuant to Rule-Making Authority ARB-TRN-10.06

I. Introduction

The City of Portland Office of Transportation issues permits to close the street for community events within the public right-of-way. Permits are issued for three types of community events: block parties, minor community events and major community events. There are no permit fees for community event street closure permits.

II. Definitions

<u>Block parties</u> are the simplest type of a community event. These events typically close no more than one block of a local service residential street for small-scale parties such as neighborhood potluck dinners and barbecues. They are usually held on weekends or holidays. Block parties are initiated by a local neighborhood group who makes application through their Local District Neighborhood Coalition.

<u>Minor community events</u> are larger events that include more than just the residents living in the immediate vicinity of the closure area. These events may close more than one block for street dances, fairs, or other neighborhood-wide events. Minor community events are initiated by a sponsoring individual or an organization that makes application directly to the City of Portland Office of Transportation, Street Systems Management.

<u>Major community events</u> are events that anticipate attendance from throughout the metropolitan area. This type of event allows closure of more than one block, closure for more than one day and may also include the use of a major street. Major community events are initiated by a sponsoring individuals or organizations that make application directly to the City of Portland Office of Transportation, Street Systems Management.

An event is automatically considered a major community event if any alcoholic product is to be available for consumption in the public-right-of-way. Major community events in which alcoholic beverages are available require an ordinance from City Council and a fee is charged for processing the ordinance through City Council.

III. Administrative Rule

Block Party
