a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

This project will install two bore and jack steel casings and 18-inch stormwater pipes under I-5 along with manholes, catch basins and stormwater collection piping on the east shoulder of I-5. Lane closures on I-5 will only be allowed at night. The project also includes new stormwater piping, manholes and catch basins that cross Barbur Boulevard, Barbur Court and SW 26th Avenue to divert stormwater from the existing conveyance system to the proposed treatment facilities. The treatment facilities consist of tiered treatment bays by concrete retaining walls with peak overflow weirs and under drain systems. Typical construction impacts to the community may include noise from construction equipment, vibration due to open trench and trenchless work, and disruption to traffic due to open trench work and other related construction activities. There is a bus stop in the vicinity that may be temporarily relocated during construction. Trees will be removed in ODOT right of way and the sites will be planted for treatment, erosion prevention and site aesthetics following construction.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State of Oregon as minority, women, and emerging small businesses. They became involved when the project advertised for bids on February 21, 2014.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Bids received resulted in the award of the construction contract.

d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

Procurement Services advertised the project for bids and held the prebid meeting that was open to the construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State as minority, women, and emerging small businesses.

- 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 18342 adopted November 20, 2013 authorized a contract and provided for payment for the Interstate 5 at SW 26th Ave Water Quality Facility. This project is being designed and constructed under the terms of the Master Intergovernmental Agreement (184384), between the City of Portland and the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) to retrofit stormwater facilities of mutual interest within the City's jurisdictional areas.
- 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT: The engineer's estimate for this project was \$2,600,000 and the confidence level was high. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 13/14 and FY 14/15 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, WBS Element E08679.
- 9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED: Accept Recommendation to award contract to Tapani, Inc. in the amount of \$2,125,604.40.
- 10. SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT: The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and supervision necessary to construct three new water quality facilities along the following streets: Barbur Blvd from the Barbur Court intersection to SW

 22^{nd} Ave. SW 26^{th} Way from the I5 overpass to the Barbur Blvd overpass and I5 from SW 28^{th} Ave to SW 25^{th} Ave.
