The Water Bureau and Multnomah County have been partnering for administration of eligibility verification for the Water/Sewer Bill Discount and Crisis Assistance Program since 1995. The program offers financial assistance to customers with verified financial need for assistance with water/sewer bills. This ordinance will continue that partnership for five (5) more years.

Self Enhancement, Inc. Community Services, Human Solutions, Impact NW, Neighborhood House, Salvation Army IRCO - Asian Family Services, Native American Rehabilitation Association, Native American Youth & Family Center and Catholic Charities - El Programa Hispano, as well as Multnomah County participate in this program.

The services provided by this program have been reviewed through the City's annual budget process since 1995. The Water Bureau's Budget Advisory Committee, comprised of Water Bureau Management, labor representatives and community members have reviewed this program as part of the budget development process.
