## ORDINANCE NO. 186582

\* Amend an Intergovernmental Agreement with Multnomah County for the operation of the Crisis Assessment and Treatment Center to reflect changes to the terms of the agreement (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 30002752)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Central City Concern (CCC) is a non-profit corporation and the owner of the Crisis Treatment and Assessment Center (CATC), located at 55 NE Grand Ave in the City of Portland. The County donated the building to CCC in 2005.
- 2. On July 1, 2011, the City and County entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) to provide funds for the operation of the CATC. The IGA is attached as Exhibit A.
- 3. The City, County, and CCC agreed on a concept for a CATC project as follows:
  - a. Operation of the CATC is funded by Medicaid, state funding, insurance proceeds, and contributions from the City and the County.
  - b. Lease of space on the first and second floors of the CATC is subleased by the County to CCC.
- 4. The City agreed to pay 50 percent of the annual CATC operating costs in excess of those covered by Medicaid, state funding, and insurance proceeds, the exact funding amount to be assessed on an annual basis.
- 5. The City and County wish to amend the terms in the Termination section of the IGA. The changes have been agreed upon by both parties.
- 6. The City and the County are negotiating a swap of service delivery that may include City funding for annual CATC operating costs under terms of Contract No. 30002752.
- 7. The amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement is attached as Exhibit B.

## NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

a. The Mayor and Auditor are authorized to amend Contract No. 30002752 with Multnomah County as outlined in a form substantially in accordance with the amendment attached as Exhibit B.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the contract budget was reduced in the FY 2012-13 Fall Budget Monitoring process and it is in the best interest of all parties involved that the contract be updated to reflect these changes. Any delay would

unnecessarily impact the other interested parties. Therefore this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
