Willamette Park is the largest motorized boat launch on the Willamette River in the Portland metropolitan region. Parks recently put parking meters in Willamette Park to generate maintenance funds for the upkeep and improvements at the park. The majority of people who use the parking lot are motorized boaters. If the boat ramp is not repaired, revenue could potentially decrease if boaters launch at smaller

sites or outside of the City of Portland. It is difficult to determine the potential reduction in revenue.

5) Expense: What are the costs to the City as a result of this legislation? What is the source of funding for the expense? The initial cost is \$31,200 and a contingency of \$15,000 to complete the permitting that will paid from PP&R's major maintenance funds. The initial cost for dredging is estimated to be \$377,132; five (5) year maintenance is \$261,551; and ten (10) year is \$261,551. The initial dredging is scheduled for FY14/15. PP&R will be applying for an Oregon State Marine Board grant to fund 75% of the cost for the initial dredging and project management. PP&R will need to provide a 25% match.
