 - a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

The project includes relocation of Johnson Creek to a protected crossing over the trunk sewer and away from industrial properties, reconnecting floodplains and creating off channel refuge for STE species, addressing two stormwater outfalls, constructing an ADA accessible trail system that connects the Springwater trail to the site and lays the groundwork for a community park. Typical construction impacts to the community may include noise from construction equipment, vibration due to grading work, and limited disruption to traffic due to hauling activities on Luther Road and the Springwater Trail and other related construction activities. The only construction entrance to the site is down the Springwater Trail. The trail will remain open during construction and pedestrian and bicycle traffic will be limited to a 4-5 foot lane. Trees will be removed in Clackamas County right of-way and the sites will be planted by BES Watershed Revegetation Program with native species following construction.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State of Oregon as minority, women, and emerging small businesses. They became involved when the project advertised for bids on February 26, 2014.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Bids received resulted in the award of the construction contract.

d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

Procurement Services advertised the project for bids and held the prebid meeting that was open to the construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State as minority, women, and emerging small businesses.

- 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 186341 adopted November 30, 2013 authorized a contract and provided for payment for the Luther Road Habitat Restoration Project. The Luther Road Habitat Restoration project involves the construction of improvements along Johnson Creek in the vicinity of the exposed 76-inch Lents Sewer Interceptor crossing Johnson Creek. The project site is bounded from east to west by SE 76th Avenue and SE Bell Avenue and north to south by SE Luther Road and SE Overland Street. The project involves rehabilitating and stabilizing the existing Lents Sewer Interceptor crossing of Johnson Creek by relocating approximately 2000 feet of the Johnson Creek channel and floodplain.
- 8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT:</u> The engineer's estimate for this project was \$3,630,000 and the confidence level was Optimal. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2014 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, WBS Element E06947.
- 9. **RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED:** Accept Recommendation to award contract to Colf Construction, LLC in the amount of \$2,431,824.00.
- 10. **SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT:** The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and supervision necessary to relocate approximately 2000 feet of

Johnson Creek channel and floodplain. The 72-inch Lents trunkline sewer crosses Johnson Creek near SE 72nd Avenue in Clackamas County and is currently at risk of failure due to the natural migration and down cutting of Johnson Creek. The City plans to partially relocate and restore Johnson Creek to protect the sewer crossing and increase distance to industrial properties.
