# 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The civil suit was brought against the City of Portland and an individual police officer Devonna Dick by William and Denise Wilson on behalf of their daughter Cayla Wilson and granddaughter Jaikyla Wilson. Through their attorney, the Wilsons claimed damages in excess of \$40 million. These damages resulted from a car crash caused by a third party named Jack Dean Whiteaker. He crashed his vehicle into the car driven by Cayla Wilson on April 15, 2010. Cayla Wilson was 19 and pregnant at the time of the crash. She subsequently gave birth to a daughter, Jaikyla. Cayla suffered catastrophic, permanent injuries as a result of the crash. Jaikyla suffered some complications at birth. Both Cayla and Jaikyla are being cared for by the Wilson family.

Plaintiffs claim Officer Dick negligently failed to take Mr. Whiteaker into custody during two different contacts with him earlier in the day of the crash. Had she done so, they alleged, Mr. Whiteaker would not have caused the crash that resulted in their daughter's injuries. However, Officer Dick did not have probable cause to arrest Mr. Whiteaker. She followed her training and appropriate process to address the situation at the time she had contact with him. It was not reasonable to expect her to predict his future actions.

At the time of this event, the City self-insured liability defense and damages up to \$1, million. The City transferred the financial risk of losses above this \$1 million retention to commercial excess liability insurance policies.

On October 30, 2013, four weeks before the original trial date, the excess liability insurance

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adjuster contacted the City. His assessment of the case was that it should not be tried, but rather settled. He believed the risk of a sympathetic jury was too great and potential damages too high to risk a trial. The insurer requested that they undertake control of the case and demanded the City preserve the unspent remainder of its retention for settlement purposes. The City could have been liable for the full amount of claimant's damages if it denied the insurer's request.

Ultimately, the insurance company representative took control of the defense and settled both Cayla and Jaikyla's claims against the City. The City expended more than \$183,000 defending the case prior to the settlement. The amount remaining in the City's self-insured retention and owed by the City to the claimant is \$816,263.18

### 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement will result in a payment of \$816,263.18 from the liability fund.
