# ORDINANCE No. 186614

Authorize grant agreements or Intergovernmental Agreements with thirteen community groups related to the Community Watershed Stewardship Program up to \$95,000 total. (Ordinance)

### The City of Portland ordains:

#### Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Portland City Council adopted the Clean River Program on April 6, 1990. In 1995, the Bureau of Environmental Services developed the Community Watershed Stewardship Program (CWSP) to provide grant funds and technical assistance for citizen-led watershed projects. On March 8, 2006, the Council adopted the 2005 Portland Watershed Management Plan which describes actions for watershed health including citizen led activities such as natural area revegetation, education, involvement and stewardship. On May 2, 2012, Council adopted Resolution #36920, reaffirming the City's commitment to watershed health.
- 2. These grants have been selected for FY14-15: Friends of Malden Court Community Orchard (\$9,995); Green Lents Johnson Creek Clean-Up (\$4,500); Verde Cully Residential Rain Gardens (\$9,825); Native American Youth and Family Center (NAYA) Illahee Gardens (\$4,700); Holy Redeemer School Stormwater Management (\$8,000); Trinity Full Gospel Pentecostal Church Rain Garden (\$6,000); Linnton Neighborhood Association Hoge Creek Project (\$4,975); Russian Speaking Network of Oregon Naturescaping for Better Environmental Education (\$5,580); Depave Faith Community Church Parking Lot Stormwater Retrofit (\$9,875); Micro-Enterprise Services of Oregon MLK Rain Garden Phase II (\$6,000); Momentum Alliance Environmental Camp and Restoration Project (\$8,000); SOLVE Trillium Creek Restoration Project (\$9,550); Tryon Creek Watershed Council Restoration Mentors (\$8,000). Additional community projects will be awarded mini-grants not exceeding \$500 each for the purchase of native plants for small community projects (\$3,000).
- 3. The established cost is \$95,000 for the grants and \$3,000 for the native plant mini- grants. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY14-15 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Cost Center ESWS000007.

### NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute grant agreements and intergovernmental agreements for the purpose described in Section 1, in substantially the same forms as Exhibits A and B attached herein, in the amount of \$95,000.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
