

ORDINANCE No. 186619

\* Accept a grant in the amount of \$49,921 from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services 2013 Community Policing Development – Micro Grants Program to fund the Police Bureau’s strategic equity plan development process (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Police Bureau applied to the United States Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) for a grant in the amount of \$49,921 for the 2013 Community Policing Development – Micro Grants Program on June 6, 2013; and
2. DOJ COPS has notified the City that it will award a grant for the 2013 Community Policing Development – Micro Grants Program to the Police Bureau in the amount of \$49,921; and
3. The award, known as a Cooperative Agreement, requires cooperation with the COPS Office for the planning and management of the Agreement, coordination of grant-funded activities, acceptance of the COPS Office information and technical assistance, planning and development of strategies used in the project, and cooperation with the federal program manager; and
4. The Community and Police Relations Committee (CPRC), a subcommittee of the City’s Human Rights Commission (HRC), designated a subcommittee to design and implement a plan to address issues intersecting institutionalism and race in the Police Bureau. The grant award will fund the Bureau’s strategic equity plan development process; and
5. The DOJ will reimburse the City for program expenses not to exceed \$49,921, which includes a research partnership with Portland State University for development of an evaluation plan and a consultant to develop a strategic organizational plan; and
6. The grant period is September 1, 2013, through August 31, 2015. No match is required for this grant; and
7. The Council declares an emergency exists because a delay would jeopardize the awarding of the grant funds from DOJ COPS.

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NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor and the Chief of Police are hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland a grant from DOJ COPS for the 2013 Community Policing Development – Micro Grants Program in the amount of \$49,921.
- b. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's and Chief's behalf.
- c. The Chief of the Police Bureau of the City is authorized to accept on behalf of the City any subsequent modifications by DOJ COPS for the 2013 Community Policing Development – Micro Grants Program, Cooperative Agreement #2013-CK-WX-K030, provided such modifications do not increase the City's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.

Section 2. The Council declares an emergency exists because a delay would jeopardize the awarding of the grant funds from DOJ COPS. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.


